A passing tramp offers them £7 a week to look after his mobile piano for a month and they discover that it gives everyone within earshot an irresistible desire to dance.

Timothy's parents, however, want him to find a proper job with one of his influential uncles, and Jane's mother wants her to marry a wealthy Lord! Infused with post-war optimism and filled with foot-tapping, catchy musical numbers - *Oh, Look at Me*, *Out of Breath* and *It's Easy to Sing*
