I will grant that the subject matter (celebrating the 200th anniversary of the abolition of slavery) may have put off some people who wanted a jolly night out and that the advertising of the event was somewhat low key, but Ledbury should have put on a better show. If these sorts of events are going to come to Ledbury again, they need to be supported.
