'Sketches of Old Ledbury' is a collection of the drawings of artist Cheryl Davies and includes many of the interesting buildings of the town.

'Herefordshire Hop Kilns' is an illustrated guide to these unique agricultural buildings dotted in the landscape around Ledbury whilst book one in the series 'Signs Into History' gives a fascinating account of the history of place names in the Ledbury area. Other books in this series cover the whole of Herefordshire. These are 'Herefordshire, this Magic Land Twixt England & Wales' (an account of the landscape and fascinating history of the county) 'Herefordshire Post Boxes' and 'Bromyard Windows'.
